"This movie is about the touching friendship that develops between a journalist and a brilliant street musician, and how their unusual bond affects both in different ways," explains Thomas Holmes, a social worker who helps young people living with a psychotic disorder. He will take part in the discussion after the screening.

"The young heroine in this movie, all of 12 years old, embarks on an adventure that turns out to be a quest for her identity—something that every child experiences and which adults help guide them through," notes Colette Boucher, a psychologist working with children and pre-adolescents. She will join in the discussion after the film.
